Grant Applicant's Parent/Guardian

The Wisconsin Bird and Game Breeders Association's Youth Grant Program is an award of grant money given to a student between the ages of 12 and 17 to assist him or her in completing a project involving the propagation of poultry, gamebirds, rabbits, and waterfowl.

- Students between the ages of 10 and 17 may apply. Age on January 1st of the current year will be used to determine eligibility.
- This grant is to be used for the sole purpose of assisting with start-up expenses incurred by the student in a project involving the propagation of poultry, gamebirds, rabbits, and waterfowl.
- Amount of grant money requested by the applicant may not exceed \$300.00.
- The amount awarded per request is dependent upon the money available in any given year and the number of requests approved. Not all requests may be funded.
- Only one grant may be awarded to an individual in a calendar year; however, students who
 have received a grant in previous years may apply for a grant in successive years provided they
 meet all the eligibility requirements. Preference may be given to those applicants who have not
 received a grant previously.
- Interested applicants must submit a typewritten plan of their intended project along with their completed application (See Application for more information).
- Applications must be signed by both the student and his or her parent/guardian to be accepted by the grant committee.
- The completed application, along with the project plan (including a list of estimated costs) must be submitted to the grant program's chairman by January 1st.
- All grant applications will be reviewed and grant recipients will be chosen by the Wisconsin Bird and Game Breeders Association's Youth Grant committee. Grant applicants will be notified by March 1st. All decisions of the committee will be final.
- Upon notification of the grant award, the grant recipient will have 90 days to submit receipts showing materials purchased for his/her projects.
- At the completion of the project, the grant recipient shall submit a final report to the grant committee. This report shall by due by September 1st and should include an essay describing the project and how the grant money was used, and two or more photos: one of themselves and at least one of their completed project. The essay and phones will be published in "The Pen", the official publication of the Wisconsin Bird and Game Breeders Association. Photographs submitted will become the property of the Wisconsin Bird and Game Breeders Association and will not be returned.
